VICKERY PLACE CONSERVATION TOWN HALL MEETING
Tuesday, November 15, 7 pm
Vickery Towers



Come learn more and be a part of the Vickery Place Conservation District process. This is the second in a series of eight town hall meetings conducted by the City of Dallas Planning Department. Through these meetings we, as a neighborhood, will develop our conservation ordinance, tailoring it to our needs. It can be as rigorous as specifying certain elements such as building materials, or it can simply define height and setbacks of new construction—WE DECIDE.

Below are some of the building standards that are commonly regulated through a Conservation District. The current standards per Dallas City Building Code are in *italics*:

Architectural Style – currently there is no standard. Craftsman (bungalow), Prairie Style, Tudor, Colonial

Revival, Spanish Eclectic and Minimal Traditional are predominant in Vickery Place.

Height of structure – *30 ft. max.* Measurement taken from the top of the grade to the mid-point of slope of roof (between the peak and the eave).

Front Setback - *25 ft. min.* Distance from the sidewalk (or easement) to the front of the structure (wall or column).

Side Setback – *5 ft. min.* Distance from the property line to the wall of the house (excludes fireplace or roof eave)

Garage location and size – currently there is no standard. Most common in Vickery Place are detached, in the rear of the property.

These building standards will be discussed at the 2nd Community Meeting on Tuesday, November 15th. Please plan to attend this meeting to learn more about what is allowed under the current building code and standards you would like to see regulated. Together we can decide the look of future development in Vickery Place.

KATY TRAIL "BLUE BIKES" PROGRAM UP AND RUNNING RIDING!

In August, the Friends of the Katy Trail began the "Blue Bikes" program. Thanks to a donation by the Dasani water company of 20 new Trek cruiser bicycles and storage lockers, these bikes are now available for public use on the trail! To use one of the beautiful new bikes, you must be a current member of the Friends of the Katy trail. Memberships start at just \$35. Membership contributions help pay for off-duty police patrols along the trail and are tax deductible. Members can receive a Blue Bikes swipe card by contacting the office at 214-303-1180 or by email at office@katytraildallas.org and requesting the Blue Bikes use form. Simply swipe your card to remove bike from locker. When you've finished your ride, return the bike to the locker so that others may enjoy a Blue Bikes ride! Safe riding tips while on the trail:

- Always wear a helmet. Dallas City Code requires that all riders of all ages wear helmets on bicycles or in carriers, trailers, sidecars, etc. Parents are legally responsible for ensuring that their children wear helmets!
- Announce yourself clearly when passing anyone – from walkers to skaters. "Passing on your left" is a clear and courteous way to communicate.
- Stay to the right and pass on the left. Ride in a straight line and don't make sudden, unpredictable moves.
- Ride at a speed you can control.
- Don't ride with headphones. You can't be completely aware of your surroundings and others can't communicate with you.
- Use hand and arm signals: point in the direction you're going for turns and put your hand down, facing backward, to indicate slowing and stopping. (The old left-hand only signals are not recommended, as most people don't know them.)
- When riding on roads, remember that Texas law considers your bicycle a vehicle.

PILGRIM PUMPKIN CAKE WITH PENUCHE CREAM

In a busy fast food world we all need timesavers and this half-way home-made fall desert takes the cake.

- 1 package Spice Cake Mix
- 1 can (1 lb).solid pack pumpkin
- 2 tsp. baking soda
- 2 eggs
- ½ cup water

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray 9 x 13 oblong cake pan with non stick coating and lightly flour or use Bakers Joy* type product. In a large mixing bowl combine all ingredients and beat 30 seconds on low and 4 minutes on medium, scraping bowl. Pour batter into prepared pan and bake for 45 to 50 minutes.

While cake is baking, prepare Penuche Cream. Beat all ingredients until stiff. Serve cake warm with Penuche Cream.

- 1 cup cream for whipping
- ¼ cup brown sugar (packed)
- 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 tsp. rum extract

This is a versatile cake. I have added ½ cups nuts and /or raisins to batter. Cooled cake and frosted it with a basic cream cheese frosting. Either way it is easy and good. ~Shelia Huffman
